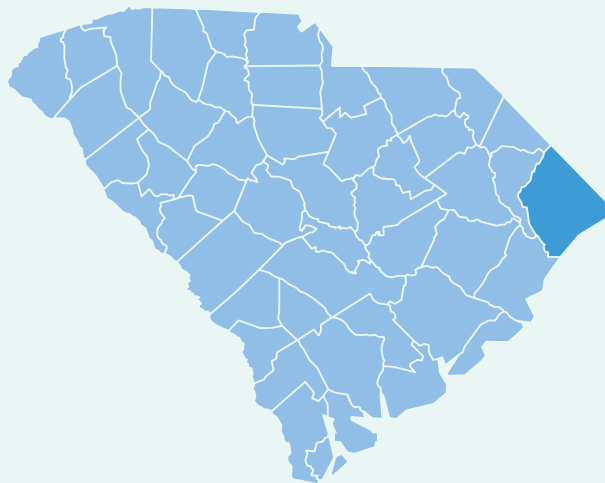

to score at the highest level on the Kindergarten Readiness Assessment

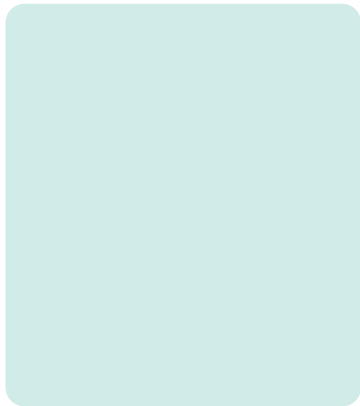


34% less likely

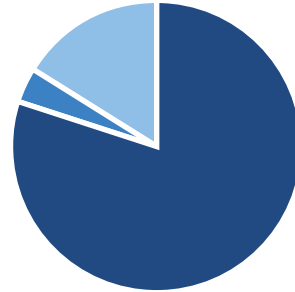
